We have also acquired an additional six toppers and two six stack trailers. Thanks particularly to Mike who was instrumental to the running of the Single Handed Team Racing and has also puta lot of effort sorting the new toppers and equipment.

Jon will cover finances within his separate Treasurers report, but we remain strong financially growing both our cash and asset position.

As mentioned last year, Jon and Viv are stepping down at this AGM. Both have put a huge amount into the NSSA over the years. On behalf of the NSSA and particularly myself and the other members of the committee I would like to thank them both, wish them all the best for the future and look forward to hopefully seeing them at some future events.

Subject of course to the formalities of this meeting we welcome Carol Blades as our new Safeguarding Officer and thank Ed, Emily, Mike and Nathan for their support as committee members.

It is with sadness we heard that Terry Beale passed earlier this month. Terry was involved in NSSA for many years, including the early Single Handed Team Racing Events at Upton Warren and was one of our Vice Presidents. NSSA Treasurer's Report 2023-24

November 2024

Highlights from the Income/Expenditure sheet

- Subscriptions (all membership categories) are healthy.
 - You might recall that the £5000 from 2022-23 included around £1200 from 2021-22 (PayPal account balance). Therefore, the actual membership income for 2022-23 is around £3850.
 - 2023-24 shows membership income dropped slightly: £3500 vs £3850.
- Donations: thank you to Peak Processing for a very generous donation.
- Regatta income: SHTR at Bartley was the only event to go fully through NSSA accounts (small profit), hence the drop in both income and expenditure relating to regattas.
- Expenditure is broadly the same throughout
 - Equipment: £3583 on new bibs for team racing long overdue!
 - Regatta bursaries (Draycote NYR) were particularly popular committee decision to support as many sailors as possible.
 - Presidents Award: represents over 1/3 of total expenditure, a significant sum which isn't really covered by income, unless donations are received. Is this sustainable?

And on the balance sheet

- Payments in advance represents a deposit for the Presidents Award trip in August 2024.
- Liabilities: Invoice unpaid at year end £880 to Peak Processing for IT.

Overall, the association remains in a comfortable financial situation, and the committee is actively looking to set aside funds to ensure a secure future for the association.

1. Accounting policies

These accounts are drawn up on an accruals basis and include a Balance Sheet. An Annual Return, on a Receipts and Payments basis, is submitted to the Charity Commission

2. Investment Assets

The shares referred to are share in the COIF Charities Investment Fund. The Charities Official Investment Fund (COIF) is a fund available only to charities and is managed by CCLA Investment Management Ltd., 85 Victoria Street, London, EC4V 4ET

3. NSSA regattas

The amount shown is the net proceeds of the NSSA national regattas during this period:

- National Youth Regatta, Draycote
- Singlehanded team racing, Bartley
- Doublehanded team racing, Banbury

4. Depreciation

The equipment shown on the Balance Sheet has been depreciated linearly at an annual rate of 20%.

5. Audit

The association is indebted to Rachel Crawford FCA for acting as honorary independent examiner and her attached report form part of these accounts.

6. Current Assets & Restricted funds

The amounts in "Restricted Funds" headings represent funds allocated to the NSSA Presidents Award. The Balance Sheet amount is made up of past donations less net costs associated with the Presidents Award.

7. Debtors

All debtors from the previous year are cleared. No debtors for the current year.

8. Paypal balance - £5729

Paypal balance is now declared separately.

9. Payments in advance - £1449

Deposit payment to Tall Ships Youth Trust for Presidents Award trip due to take place in August 2024.
